

What Is A Deacon

According to the Bible, the term deacon comes from the Greek word diakonos meaning "servant" or "minister." The word, which appears at least 29 times in the New Testament, designates an appointed member of the local church who assists by serving other members and meeting material needs. As a deacon, your major attention will be given to serving God under the leadership of the pastor and deacon coordinators in the practical ministry of the church.

This includes doing the benevolence work; call and visit the sick and shut-in, which includes hospital visits; promote unity within the Church, and facilitate the spread of the gospel.

Three things during LENT.

Prayer:

Fasting:

Fasting during Lent involves abstaining from certain foods or activities as a way to show humility and focus on spiritual matters. While the specific practices vary, many Catholics abstain from meat on Fridays and Ash Wednesday.

Almsgiving:

Almsgiving involves giving to those in need, whether through donations, volunteering, or acts of service. It's a way to show compassion and generosity, reflecting the teachings of Jesus.

Cardiopulmonary Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Training

Cardiopulmonary Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) is a vital skill that everyone, regardless of age or gender, should learn. To enhance the safety and preparedness of its staff, Union Chapel Christian Academy, employees and various church office personnel participated in a basic CPR class in March to acquire life-saving knowledge. CPR is a critical emergency procedure performed when someone's heart stops beating or they are unable to breathe. The main objective of CPR is to maintain blood circulation and supply oxygen to essential organs, especially the brain, until medical professionals arrive. This intervention can significantly increase the chances of survival, often doubling or tripling the likelihood. As a result of this class, Union





Chapel Christian Academy employees will be better equipped to care for each other and the welfare of our students.

Taking a CPR class equips individuals with the confidence and know-how to act effectively in an emergency. The beginner-level CPR class covered essential topics such as how to recognize and assess emergency distress signals. Using adult and infant mannequins, each participant practiced the following skills:

- •Using an Automated External Defibrillator (AED): Participants learned how to operate an AED, which helps restore a normal heart rhythm in cases of sudden cardiac arrest.
- •Performing rescue breathing: Techniques for creating a tight seal to ensure air reaches the lungs were demonstrated.
- •Administering chest compressions: Proper hand placement and push rates for maintaining blood flow were taught.
- •The Heimlich maneuver: Participants practiced this technique to assist choking adults and children.
- •CPR for different age groups: The class emphasized how CPR techniques for infants and children differ from those used for adults, adapting to their smaller size and developmental stages.

The hands-on approach made the learning process engaging and practical. Upon completing the four-hour class, participants earned CPR certification, valid for two years. Enrolling in a CPR class is an investment in your own knowledge and in the safety of those around you. By learning this skill, you'll be prepared to act





